Collection Development Policy: Reconsideration

Libraries have diverse materials and programs representing varied points of view. Peabody Public Library provides access to information and resources to all library users, following guidelines set forth in its Collection Development Policy, Library Policy, The Library Bill of Rights, and the Freedom to Read Statement of the American Library Association.

Peabody Public Library acknowledges that the library may acquire resources, display exhibits, and host programs that do not align with all patrons' beliefs. Individual library users or families can decide which of these resources they choose to engage with, but they cannot restrict access to content for others.

Library patrons who believe a library program or exhibit does not meet the library's mission may complete a "Patron's Request for Reconsideration" Form. All Requests for Reconsideration will be addressed in terms of the library's mission statement, The Library Bill of Rights, and the Freedom to Read Statement of the American Library Association. The completed form will be reviewed by a committee designated by the Executive Director, including the Librarian in charge of the material, exhibit, or program. The patron will be notified in writing of the results of the review. If the committee does not reach a solution, the Request for Reconsideration will be forwarded to the President of the Library Board of Trustees. The Library Board of Trustees will take final action on the Request. The patron will be notified in writing of the decision.
