

“Old Wooden Church”



Materials Needed:

- **4-Pallet boards:** The base length should remain the same, but feel free to increase or decrease the measurements below if you want a shorter or taller version.
 - **1-Main:** 12-14"
 - **2-Sides:** 8"
 - **1-Base:** 10"-12"
- **2-Black nail Tacks:** For door knob and to hang the wreath.
- **Twine:** 4'-5', Enough to wrap around your church a few times and make a bow if desired.
- **1-2" Grapevine wreath**
- **1-Square dowel rod for cross.** (1/8"x12")
- Sandpaper
- Paint brush
- White paint
- Black paint
- Power Saw-A radial miter arm saw works best, but use whatever you have at your disposal.
- Hot glue gun
- Glue sticks

Instructions:

1. Cut pallet boards to length
2. Cut angles on the main and side boards: These can be at whatever degree you desire.
3. Sand boards to desired smoothness.
4. Cut 2 pieces of the square dowel to make the cross. Tack together with hot glue.
5. White-wash all your boards and the cross using watered down white paint. You may want to test your paint on a piece of scrap. Add water or paint to get your desired look.
6. Trace doors onto the main and side pieces and paint black. Let dry completely.
7. Using sandpaper, scuff up the paint.
8. Hot glue the sides to the main board.
9. Hot glue assembly to the base.
10. Tap in black tacks for door knob and wreath.
11. Hot glue cross and wreath in place.
12. Wrap twine around the church base 4-5 times and tack with hot glue.
13. Make a bow with remainder of twine and hot glue in place.
